About the course

This four-day course provides law enforcement personnel with the skills necessary to develop, implement, and manage an effective Community Crime Prevention program. Through lectures, small group activities, class discussions and individual projects, students will learn strategies and techniques for removing or reducing opportunities for criminal activity.

- Establish a crime prevention program within their jurisdictions.
- Obtain funding for a crime prevention program.
- Maintain a successful crime prevention program.
- Market a crime prevention program.
- Use media relations to promote a crime prevention program.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the role of crisis prevention within the mission of law enforcement.
- Recommend specific environmental designs for the security and safety of the people who live, work, or play within the area.
- Apply the principles of interpersonal communication.
- Understand what is required to conduct a home security survey.
- Select youth safety programs that will meet the needs of the community.
- Implement programs involving citizen participation in crime prevention.
